# FROM THE ORGANIZERS

West Africa is a region with enormous potential for growth and development, but also facing a wide range of shared societal and development challenges. Despite the traditional divide between Anglophone and Francophone West Africa, we share many of the same challenges including poverty, low agricultural productivity, inequality, inadequate access to healthcare and education, climate change and political instability. The region has made significant progress towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG's), but much more needs to be done to ensure that everyone has access to basic necessities of life and that economic growth is inclusive, sustainable and resilient.

To tackle these issues and achieve the SDGs, entrepreneurs have immense potential to create and scale businesses that are offering innovative products and services to the region's most marginalized population. By having for-profit businesses that create both profit and drive social outcomes, entrepreneurs will change the face of West Africa's development agenda.

However, in order for entrepreneurs to succeed, they require an enabling environment where knowledge, capital, and networks abound. Many individual actors are doing their part to support entrepreneurs in both Anglophone and Francophone West Africa: incubators, accelerators, academic institutions, investors, business associations, and policymakers. I've come to appreciate that the right partnerships make so much difference. Each of us needs to work together in partnerships that leverage our complementary strengths, expertise, and resources. By joining forces, we can support these entrepreneurs to unlock new opportunities, drive innovation, and scale their impact in ways that would be impossible for any one organization to achieve alone.

The strength of shared goals and collaborations I witnessed at my first Sankalp Africa 2023 Summit in Nairobi unveiled that Sankalp is indeed that missing piece connecting all the players, knowledge, lessons and experiences to drive efforts to make a meaningful difference in our world. Armed with this insight, our first Sankalp West Africa Summit held from 12th -13th June 2023 at the UPSA in Accra was themed 'Unleashing the Power of Partnerships to Scale Impact'. Our goal was to bring together key stakeholders, innovators, investors, and entrepreneurs to catalyze sustainable development in West Africa.

At Sankalp we believe that by leveraging our collective impact, we will enable sustainable development approaches through entrepreneurship. This is where the power of partnerships comes in, and it all started at the West Africa Summit where we hosted 80+ speakers, and over 380 participants from 23 countries over 1.5 days of networking, masterclasses, deal rooms, entrepreneur pitches, showcases, panel discussions, unconference-stye agenda and other summit-related activities to







explore opportunities for scaling impact in the West African ecosystem. Additionally, we hosted an electronic vehicle test track over the 2 days and wrapped up the event with a sustainable fashion show featuring the creative works of a selection of talented sustainable fashion designers in the region.

The Sankalp vibe was truly ignited facilitating meaningful discussions, networking, and collaborations, creating opportunities for impactful investments and partnerships. It is our hope that the outcomes and recommendations from the summit will contribute to the growth of the region's entrepreneurial ecosystem and drive positive social and economic change.

We extend our gratitude to all participants, sponsors, speakers, and partners for their valuable contributions in making the summit a memorable and impactful event.

We look forward to continued collaboration and building on the momentum generated at the Sankalp West Africa Summit.








# SANKALP WEST AFRICA AWARDS


The Sankalp West Africa Awards is an initiative aimed to inspire and create awareness about

# Circular Horizons: Exploring the Sustainable Future of West Africa's Economy

Industries such as renewable energy, waste management, sustainable agriculture, and green manufacturing hold significant potential for innovation and investment.

### **Key Insights**

- With its natural wealth, West Africa has the potential to convert resources into infrastructure, human capital, and institutional strength.
- In addition to innovations in climate action, circularity presents a powerful solution to address several pressing climate challenges in the region.
   Implementing circular practices such as extended producer responsibility, product redesign, and efficient
- Recycling systems can help reduce the carbon footprint associated with waste management.
- Adopting circular strategies in agriculture and forestry sectors, such as organic farming, agroforestry, and responsible sourcing, can reduce greenhouse gas emissions, enhance carbon sequestration, and safeguard ecosystems.
- To accelerate the transition to a circular economy in West Africa, key interventions are necessary: Fostering collaboration among stakeholders to avoid duplication of efforts and promote knowledge sharing; Capacity building and entrepreneurial support to scale up their innovations; and Investments in appropriate technology and infrastructure are vital to enable circular processes




